· The Financial Reports for March, 2023 were passed by the Committee.


• The Committee also received the signed Auditor's Report on the finances of the group and set the date for the AGM to be held on May 24th at 5:30pm at a venue to be finalised.



April also saw the children immerse themselves in the arts, from discovering the joys of mark making using poster paints to melody, harmony, or rhythm on the drums and tambourines.



They have also had access to chalk to express themselves and we have new super soft sand which the children have enjoyed rolling in and building sandcastles.








Wook Gook


We welcome everyone back for the beginning of Term two and are excited to see what is to come this term!




START A VEGETABLE GARDEN
