Managers' Report

Thank you to all parents and carers for the kindness and flexibility you have shown over the past weeks when the Centre has been in the difficult predicament of needing parents to pick up earlier. We appreciate your support and have been consistently advertising for staff to address ongoing staffing issues. We remain committed to providing the best possible care and learning experiences for the children at our service. While closing off an area of the car park has impacted accessibility to the Centre, it is exciting to see works have started on the new Kinder site with the removal of some of the trees and the surveying and marking of the building site. A reminder to parents to please be vigilant about safety during drop off and pick up ensuring the children stay close while walking through the car park.

It was such a pleasure to see the children enjoy book week last week with many dressing-up as their favourite characters. The book marks for children to take away and colour were also a big success.

Committee of Management Report

August 23rd, 2023

The Committee of Management had their August meeting this week. The following points were covered in the meeting:

- 1. Finance: The July Finance Reports were discussed and passed. This included discussion and passing of the following recommendations.
- Budget variance was noted due to significant increases in wages, Workcover and utilities. As a result, the proposed Long Day Care Fee \$111.00, OSHC Fee \$25.00 and Vacation Care Fee \$90.00 were passed. This increase had been flagged at the last meeting and in my report.
- The difficulty of attracting staff to Yarram for this sector was discussed. The committee looked at the impact of proposed changed hours of operation with the service opening 45 minutes later at 7:45am, and closing at 5.30pm (no change). Occasional bookings outside of operating hours would be available with 24 hours notice given to arrange staff.
- Changes would take place from 11th September, 2023 as per the YEL Fees Policy.
- 2. CM Report: The Centre Manager presented her report on the events of the month.
- 3. New Kinder Building: Committee Representatives on the Kinder Building Reference Group reported on the proposed timeline, proposed design for the playground, organisation of resources for the new facility, and the development of the lease of the building with the Wellington Shire.
- 4. HR: Leadership PDP meetings have taken place.
- 5. Policies: The committee reviewed and passed the following policies: First Aid, Privacy and Confidentiality, Administration of Medicine, Staff Mobile Phones, plus 5 policies from the Bush Kinder Program including Dog Awareness, Snake Awareness, Protective Clothing, Extreme Weather, and Identification and Visibility.

During the month of August, in the Bataluk room, we have been working on a range of different pieces for our 'exhibition' in the hallway. The artwork pieces have included shapes, forests, and wattle paintings. Recently, the Bataluk children have been learning about different shapes. Jan has brought in different resources to show the children, asking about the different shape of the resource during group times. This has led to individual drawings of each shape after group time. The shapes included were circles, squares, rectangles, and ovals. The forest collages were created with different coloured paper representing trunks, leaves, and flowers. The terminology mentioned has been used to widen the children's vocabulary and understanding of shapes, and trees.

Book week was a positive experience across the room with home dress ups and kinder dress ups ensuring the children felt a sense of belonging. Books that corresponded with the children's costumes were brought in from home to be shared with the group at group time. Book week is a great opportunity for children to share a variety of interests about different themed books with their teachers and peers.

We've been having such a vibrant and bustling time in Tiddalek these past few weeks!

Your child might have already chatted about "Hugs" after their Kinder sessions. Hugstopus, is a lovable Komichi friend who's here to support the children to recognize and regulate their emotions.



During the month of August up at OSHC the children have taken a huge liking to imaginative play creating their own games and playing shops, they participated in some group skits as well as some STEM and some water colour painting. As always, the gym is a huge hit as well as some of the new board games that we have got.

We also did an emergency lockdown drill with the children to facilitate the children's confidence and skills in an emergency.

In our room this month we've been making use of outside time as much as the weather will allow, including using the sand pits for long jump and trying new skills on the bars.

Ngurran is a room that uses a lot of board and card games...with purpose.

Uno Flip is a 2 sided version of Uno, with new cards and rules. It's so popular that we are 'obligated' to play it each session, first thing when we get in the room and sometimes while we are still snacking! A number of the children have either purchased or will purchase the game for home. I see this as a connection between school and home.

We also use a game called 'Rummy-O', this is a sequencing maths game that requires addition, strategy and concentration. Feedback from parents is that this is another popular game that the children would like to have at home.

Banana Choc Chip Muttins

PREP 15 mins / BAKE 20 mins Makes 12 METHOD

- 1. Preheat oven to 200 C and line a muffin tin with 12 papers. Set aside.
- 2. Place the butter in a small saucepan over medium heat and cook until the butter is melted, foaming and turned brown and smells nutty. Set aside to cool slightly. Place the flour, sugar, cinnamon, baking powder, bicarb soda and salt into a bowl and whisk to combine creating a well in the centre. Set aside.
- 3. Into a separate bowl place the brown butter, eggs, yoghurt, vanilla and mashed bananas and whisk to combine. Pour the wet ingredients into the well of the dry and using a wooden spoon stir until just combined. Do not over mix. Gently fold through the chocolate chips.
 - Evenly divide the mixture between the prepared muffin tins. Place the caster sugar and cinnamon into a small bowl and stir to combine. Sprinkle each muffin with a little cinnamon sugar.
 - Bake muffins for 15-20 minutes or until golden and when a skewer inserted removes cleanly. Enjoy x

INGREDIENTS

3/4 cup (190 ml) butter

2 1/2 cups (375 grams) plain flour

11/4 cups (260 grams) dark brown sugar

1 teaspoon cinnamon, ground

1/2 teaspoon baking powder

1 teaspoon bicarb soda pinch of salt

2 eggs

- 1 1/2 cups (375 ml) Greek (or natural) yoghurt
- 2 tablespoons vanilla bean paste (or extract)
- 2 bananas, mashed
- 11/2 cups (260 grams) dark chocolate chips
- 3 tablespoons caster sugar (or demerara sugar)
- 1 tablespoon cinnamon, ground
