The committee met to discuss the following points:

R U Ok? These words can make a difference to someone's day, On the 14th of September The children in the Ngarawert room painted with only Yellow in representation of R U Ok day, whilst Staff continued to support our babies' emotions and that of their Families.

The sun has been shining and the outdoor yard has proven popular with the children, In particular the sandpit where the children have enjoyed digging, scooping and dumping sand with the big trucks.

This month the children in the Wook Gook room have enjoyed painting with cooling, calm blues, and white paint. They have been putting their interpretation of a river down on paper.

This has also led to some discussions on what a river is and whether the children have ever seen a river in real life. We have displayed these beautiful art works in the foyer outside our room for all to admire.

The children have also been playing with soft playdough and the inside sensory sand, other children have played in the quiet area with the books and teddy bears, taking a break and listening to a story, or making up their own stories with the activities set up in the room.













Throughout the month of August, the Bataluk children and educators investigated many new learning intentions. These included exploring the sun and the moon. The children created their own sun's and moons out of cut up paper, glue, chalk, and utilised stimuli as reference. These artworks were taken out to our 'Bataluk exhibition' to showcase the children's work.

We have also welcomed Hannah back to the Bataluk room this month. Hannah has shared her stories about travelling all over Europe and Asia. This has prompted an inquiry into geography and where we are placed in the world.

These school holidays, we have been having a blast! For Science day, the children loved the process of seeing how slime is made and the affects of bubbles in different contexts.

We also experimented with how to make edible bugs with seasonal fruit on PJ day, then watched A Bug's Life. We have all been looking forward to Term 4 where we will get to have more school





Throughout the start of September, the children played a lot of board games, card games and did a few craft activities. We also took advantage of nice weather and got outside some of the afternoons. The last 2 weeks of the month were the school holidays where the children did a variety of things including some cupcake decorating with Renee from Sweet Tooth creations, a couple of excursions around town as well as to WynCity and the Eureka Skydeck and some days spent at the school.

These are pictures of a child using a previously constructed area in the sandpit during school lunchtime, made for the use of the dinosaurs the school has for the children's imaginative play.

The area now was to be a 'vet' area for this child to share with others in our OSHC session. The pale areas on the dinosaur's skin are patches of wet sand applied to 'help the dinosaur recover from his illness', something the child had thought up himself and wanted to share with others attending. With some open-ended questions, we were helped to understand how the child had added his own imaginative play to what was already used during school time.

Value:

Play-based learning encourages children to use what they know and add to it, called 'scaffolding'. For this child, it was what he'd been building during school lunch play (engineering), then adding to it by extending the use of that item in the sandpit to build on things he'd experienced with his own pets going to the vet for medical care.

The fact this was generously shared with others in the session of OSHC means the value is proven for play-based learning to nurture and foster imagination, sharing and possible future aspirations.



Learning about calendars with your child helps toddlers learn and become familiar with temporal concepts, new vocabulary, number sequencing and patterns.



You can talk about each month in the year, which are summer months, which are Winter. When is your birthday, when is your siblings' birthdays? Write in special dates and countdown to big events. You might even like to create your own calendar. You can use a WORD template or create one and have it printed through VISTA print.



NINJA WARRIOR

Short simple activities to get some active minutes in the day.

Create a Ninja Warrior obstacle course in your backyard!

Your home is full of objects you can use for the course, buckets, ladders, play equipment, heavy cans, ropes, hula hoops. You can also mix the obstacle race with a treasure hunt. Include obstacles that involve agility, jumping, balancing, climbing, crawling, strength and teamwork. Check for safety and have fun!



Our service is working towards good oral health for our children Help your kids to brush their teeth twice a day



Clean well

How to brush teeth

- Use a pea sized amount of toothpaste on a small head, soft toothbrush.
- Use low fluoride toothpaste (for children aged 18 months to 6 years).
- Use regular fluoride toothpaste if your dentist or oral health professional tells you.
- Aim the toothbrush bristles: at an angle towards the gum line.
- Move the brush in small circles over each tooth.



- surfaces of all teeth.
- For the back teeth, brush backwards and forwards.
- · Spit out the toothpaste after brushing.
- You do not need to rinse, as the small amount of fluoridated toothpaste left in your mouth after spitting continues to protect against tooth decay.

Electric toothbrushes also do a good job of cleaning teeth.



VEGGIE PACKED CHICKEN BOLOGNESE

PREP 5 mins | COOK 30 mins | SERVES 6

INGREDIENTS

1 onion

2 carrots

2 zucchinis

1 stick celery

3 garlic cloves minced

80 g bacon pieces

500g chicken mince

400ml passata

200ml chicken stock

60ml milk

2 tbs tomato puree

1 tbs white wine vinegar

1 tsp sugar

2 bay leaves

1 tbs oregano

salt and pepper

400g spaghetti

parmesan to serve

METHOD

- 1. Finely chop onion, grate carrots and zucchini.
- 2. Fry the onion, carrot, zucchini, celery, bacon, and garlic in 1 tablespoon of olive oil for 3-4 minutes until softened.
- 3. Turn the heat up to high and add the chicken mince. Fry until the chicken mince has changed colour. This will take roughly 3-4 minutes.
- 4. Add in the passata, stock, tomato puree, milk, white wine vinegar, bay leaves, oregano, sugar, salt and pepper. Simmer for 25-30 minutes.
- 5. Cook pasta to instructions
- 6. Add grated parmesan and a sprinkling of chopped parsley.

Tip: Add a can of chopped tomatoes for extra veggies.
