It's December, which means Christmas trees go up, fireworks light up the sky for the new year ahead, but we also say farewell to our Bataluk children who carry the memories of their 2024 pre-kinder journey as they embark on a new adventure of 4-year-old kinder in 2025. During term 4 our children have re-explored the topic of lizards using beautiful materials like glass pebbles and shiny objects to collage their own silhouette of lizards and have done the same with Christmas trees the past week, all whilst practicing our celebration dance. Our Celebration Dance is the finality of the children's learning journey where the Bataluk children are now ready to spread their wings and fly to the Tiddalek space for the next part of their journey. The celebration dance is a representation of a white egret bird that all the Bataluk children have had the pleasure of seeing when we journey over to the wetlands for nature kinder throughout the whole year. When asked "What do you enjoy about going to the wetlands?" the children's answer is always "seeing the white bird".

We would like to say a big congratulations and how very proud we are of the children's efforts and we wish you the best of luck in your new adventures and we would like to thank all the parents for their feedback and contributions throughout the year.

Well, the time has nearly come to say goodbye to our 4-year-old kindergarten children as they embark on their new journey to school. During Term 4 the children have spent a lot of time and effort completing learning tasks within the classroom. Our inquiry project 'The life cycle of a butterfly' had the children intrigued, engaged, and asking many questions about what was going to happen next.
